DONNA'S CORNER

Transition and Closure

It's hard to exist in this world, passing through milestones in our lives, without experiencing a cerebral transition. As artists we go through transitions in our studio practices. Choices in the form and style change with the emotional mood swings within ourselves as well as those we encounter throughout our creative pathways. We sometimes open or even shut down our solo studio, striking out on our own endeavors.

New roles and new projects are all about transitions. The art we create is about our life experiences & encounters throughout various stages of our lives. Usually transitions quietly occur within working environments and with new artist groups.

I have gone through many art transitions this year. I relocated into a studio environment at Northern Clay Center. I left Artistry Community Art Center, which was closer to home. It was a transition due to departing and moving items to another studio environment after 20 years.

During the month of September 2019, death claimed a couple of good art friends on the national level as well as from my childhood, including Mark Rogovin and Peggy Lipschutz. On a personal level they influenced the social justice and rebel inside me as an artist during my complex youth. I started as a community artist learning about paint, what colors were, and about the politics of the world. I grew up and still carried social justice in my ceramics and upon becoming the BISQUE resident for Northern Clay Center had ambitions to invite them to view my work as an adult artist on a national level.

So many artists I know personally are also mourning the loss of close family members this year. The losses include parents, children, spouse, lovers, and finally pet babies.

Yes, these life cycle events impact artists' emotional transitions. it often changes the way we do our art and the reason why we might select a certain theme. It is healing and gives us memories to create new art with purpose.
